Confessions of a "house" whisperer

"Sometimes it's only when you open up a wall that you can see what's going on," he says. "But often you get a feeling for what's happening to a house by just walking around. You can tell how the weather and the years have affected it. You know what's going on inside."

Bill knows what to look for then, and he's taught his craftsmen to do the same – so they avoid patching over the surface when you may have significant problems underneath. They'll also let you know what to look out for down the road and what special steps you can take to better protect your home.

Bill loves his work. "Of course everyone needs to make money," he says. "But the big payback for me is when the owners tell me they're happy with what we've done – and then we feel happy about it too."
